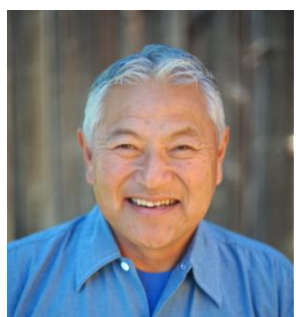

David Mas Masumoto is an organic farmer and the author of nine books including: Epitaph for a Peach and The Perfect Peach, a family farm cookbook he, along with his wife and daughter published in 2013. A feature documentary, Changing Season, about the theme of succession on a family farm, will be featured at film festivals and nationally broadcast by PBS in May, 2016.

A third generation farmer, Masumoto grows organic peaches, nectarines, and raisins on an 80 acre farm south of Fresno, California. Masumoto is currently a columnist for The Fresno Bee and the Sacramento Bee. Wisdom of the Last Farmer was honored as “Best Environmental Writing in 2009” by National Resources Defense Council. The Perfect Peach was named by USA Today as one of best summer cookbooks in 2013. In the same year, President Obama appointed Masumoto to the National Council on the Arts, the board for the National Endowment for the Arts.

Masumoto (61) is married to Marcy Masumoto, EdD, and they have a daughter, Nikiko, 29, and a son, Korio, 22.
